1. Why this, why now






3. Southern Flavor Cozy

Ingredients:


1 box or 1 lb. powdered confection sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 - 8 ounce package cream cheese (room temperature)
1 - 8 ounce package flaked or shredded sweet coconut
Cinnamon

Directions:

Cream together the cream cheese and sugar. Add vanilla and coconut.
Mix well by hand or with electric mixer using dough hooks.
Refrigerate one hour before forming candy shapes.
Roll into small walnut sized 1" balls then cover with ground cinnamon.
Candy resembles small potatoes.
Refrigerate candy to keep firm; lasts 2-3 weeks in tight container.
